Summer Reading Program

As summer approaches, the library is getting ready to kick off the annual Summer Reading Program for kids, teens and adults. Sign-ups are in full swing; stop by the main library or our Cordry-Sweetwater branch for summer fun!

For Kids and Teens: This year we are looking forward to "Building a Better World" through fun programs, exciting weekly challenges, and great prizes. Kids and teens can come to either library location beginning

Thursday, June 1st to pick up their weekly reading challenge sheets and complete the in-house library challenge. Once they return their challenge sheet they will be entered to win a grand prize at the end of the summer. Nashville programs will run from 2-3:30 on Thursdays, June 8th-July 13th and at our Cordry-Sweetwater Branch from 2:30-3:30 June 6th-July 11th (excluding July 4th).

For Adults: Read a book (print or digital) or listen to an audiobook and record it on a reading log. You'll receive a stamp for each item on your log. New Checkout System

If you've been in during the last four weeks then you've seen our new checkout system in action. We now have the capability to send you an email reminder before your library items are due, when they become overdue and also when a hold is ready for pickup. You can log into your library account by visiting the library's website and clicking on the My Account button. Using your library barcode and the PIN 1234, you can change your login to an easy username and password, see what you have checked out (digital and print), renew items, place holds, create lists of books you want to read or listen to and save favorite searches to always find the latest items added to the collection in your area of interest. Want an in-depth one-on-one demo? Try our new Book-A-Librarian program (see above.)
