

PLAN YOUR VOTE FOR THE 2022 GENERAL ELECTION IN BROWN COUNTY

You Have the Right to Vote in Indiana If:

- You are a U.S. citizen and resident of Indiana; *AND*
- You are at least 18 years old on or before the election; *AND*
- You are not currently in prison, convicted of a crime; *AND*
- You've lived in your voting precinct at least 30 days before the election; (*If you have moved within 30 days of the election, vote at your former precinct, either in-person or absentee by mail.*) *AND*
- You are registered to vote (before the deadline).

October 11, 2022 is the deadline to register to Vote. (One Month before every Election)

- **Register to Vote online** at indianavoters.com if you have a driver's license or state id. *Or*
- **Register to Vote in person** at the Brown County Clerk's Office or call to request a form: 812-988-5510. *Or*
- **Register at the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV)** if getting a driver's license, or other business at BMV

Already registered? Check your Voter Registration status by the deadline: October 11, 2022

- On indianavoters.com, click "Check Voting Status" and enter your name and information, *Or*
- Call the Brown County Clerk's Office at 812-988-5510; *Or* the Indiana Secretary of State at 1-866-461-8683
- When checking your voter registration to be sure your status is active:
 - Verify that your mailing address and home address are correct
 - Update information if you have moved, changed PO Box, changed your name, etc.

Plan Your Vote

- **Vote Early in Person: October 12 to noon November 7, 2022 (see days/hours). Take Photo ID**
 - At the **County Annex Building**, Salmon Room, 120 Locust Lane County Office Bldg. Nashville, IN 47448
 - Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 4:00 pm, EXCEPT for November 7th which is 8:00 am to 12:00 noon
 - Saturday early voting dates will be October 29 and November 5: 9:00 am to 2:00 pm only.
- **Vote Absentee by Mail: Apply by deadline October 27, 2022**
 - Apply if you meet criteria, e.g. 65 or over, are out of town, etc. See list of criteria: <https://forms.in.gov/Download.aspx?id=8691> or indianavoters.com, "Application for Absentee Ballot"
 - Vote by Mail absentee ballot application must be received by deadline October 27, 2022
 - Return completed Mail in Ballot by deadline: **Ballot must be received by 6:00 pm Nov. 8, 2022**
- **Vote in Person Election Day: Nov. 8, 2022, 6 am to 6 pm. Take Photo ID**
 - You must vote at YOUR precinct polling place, based on your home address, or your vote won't count
 - Log into indianavoters.com to see YOUR poll location, or ask the County Clerk at 812-988-5510
- **Travel Board: Apply by deadline 12:00 noon November 7, 2022**
 - If disabled, homebound, or ill, you may request the bipartisan traveling board to come to your home
 - Apply online: <https://indianavoters.in.gov/MVPHome/PrintDocuments>, *Or*
 - Contact the County Clerk's office to request voting via traveling board: 812-988-5510.

Take Voter ID When You Vote In Person

When voting in person, you must present a government issued Photo ID such as driver's license, passport, or military id, current or expired after last general election (November 3, 2020). See samples:

Where to Vote

To vote in person Election Day November 8th, 6 am to 6 pm
You must go to the polling place where you live

Hamblen 1: Sprunica Baptist Church, 3902 Sprunica Road

Hamblen 2: Hickory Ridge Community Center, 2314 Hickory Ridge Lane

Hamblen 3: Church of the Lakes, 8844 Nineveh Road

Jackson 1 and 2: Fruitdale Volunteer Fire Department, 5200 State Road 135 (Bean Blossom)

Jackson 3 and 4: Jackson Township Volunteer Fire Department, 4831 Helmsburg Road

Van Buren: Southern Brown Volunteer Fire Department, 4040 State Road 135 South

Washington 1: The Pentecostals, 60 Mt. Liberty Road (corner of Mt. Liberty and State Road 46 East)

Washington 2: New Life Community Church, 1450 State Road 135 North

Washington 3: Parkview Church of the Nazarene, 1750 State Road 46 East (inside the church, not the Family Life Building)

NOTE: There is no longer a Washington 4 precinct. Beginning with this year's election, the four voting precincts in Washington Township will be condensed to three with the current Washington 4 being renamed Washington 3. All in-town Nashville voters will cast their vote at the Washington 2 precinct now. Voters should have received notice from the clerk if their poll location changed.

Voter locations are the same as the primary election this spring
